

The Story of an Enduring Legacy (1937-2017)

Enduring legacies begin with a magnificent vision and are sustained by dedication and sacrifice. The history of our Institution, is one of great visions translated into a reality that has grown and expanded over the last 80 years. From a tiny school with 7 children, we are now a family of over 5000 children, teachers and staff, supported by alumni spanning three generations and well-wishers from across the world.

We focus on each child, attempting to draw the best out of each individual, enveloping them in safe, loving, peaceful and cheerful school surroundings. The path is laid by our teachers, who constantly strive to excel themselves in new knowledge and methods of teaching. Bonds are built by our staff dedicated to practical issues of administering the schools.

Negating exclusivity, we focus on the underprivileged, bridging gaps between children from all socio-economic and religious backgrounds.

Today our school ranges from the crèche to Standard XII, with state-of-the-art 'Smart Classrooms', science labs and libraries, seeking to teach through project-based, hands-on learning modules. Art and craft, music, dance, sports and numerous extra-curricular activities, lift our children to levels beyond rote-learning.

Mid-day meals and health-drinks and sponsorship programs for the underprivileged, begun by our founders, continue today. With a bookshop, canteen and other facilities, we have sought to upgrade our facilities over the years.

Over the years, methods developed by us, such as the Kindergarten methods developed by Mrs. Ellen Sharma have been adopted almost all over Tamil Nadu and other parts of India, including in the Greater Chennai Corporation schools. Generations of teachers have been trained by us, and visiting teachers and scholars come from all over the world to study our educational methods.

Legacies endure but to thrive they must innovate and change with the times. We have and continue to do so, adapting to the changing world around us, adopting new teaching methods and seeking to develop the best in each child...enabling them to face the world with confidence and happiness





Coordinated movements and activities bring children together to work as a team to express their inner creativity.





Dance and music forms from all over India build bridges in our society.




